Respect Life News: Shawn Carney, the president of 40daysforlife, reported that during the most recent 40daysforlife prayer campaign, 637 babies were spared from abortion when their mothers decided not to go through with the procedure. This last campaign, a Lenten campaign, began on March 1, Ash Wednesday, and ended on April 9, Palm Sunday. It was the largest spring campaign ever. As has been the case with all previous campaigns, participants prayed in front of abortion facilities where women were entering to have their pre-born children aborted. Another result of the campaign, Carney reported further, was that 10 abortion industry workers decided to quit their jobs as well. Looking back to 2007 when the campaigns first began as coordinated efforts, Carney summed up their overall results. He noted that there were 4,876 campaigns held in which 750,000 people participated in 745 cities in 44 nations. Most significantly, 13,305 pre-born lives were saved from abortion, 154 abortion facility employees quit their jobs and 85 abortion centers where campaigns had been held, closed. Parishioners are encouraged to participate in the next campaigns in the Washington metropolitan area, to pray for their continued success and to thank God for their remarkable successes up to now.
